- Sable Brushes (synthetic is okay)
- One small (size size 0 or 2)
- One medium (in the 3 to 5 range)
- One large (5 or higher)

\*\*Round brushes are the most versatile and should be the first brushes purchased.

- A cup, dish, bowl, etc. for water
- Paper towels or rags
- For the first class, students should bring a landscape photo that they have taken, or picture from a book or magazine to use in case we can't go outside due to bad weather.
