Expressing Our Gratitude

The Lawrence Cemetery in Bayside is the final resting place for members of the Lawrence family. The cemetery's first burial occurred in 1832, with the most recent in 1939. Notable individuals interred here include Cornelius W. Lawrence, NYC's first popularly elected mayor; Frederick Newbold Lawrence, former President of the New York Stock Exchange; Mary Nicolls Lawrence, wife of Mayor Andrew H. Mickle and Lawrence Moccasin, a servant to Judge Effingham Lawrence and a Native American. In 1967, the NYC Landmarks Preservation Commission designated the Lawrence Cemetery as a landmark.

BHS has protected and restored the historic cemetery after storms and maintained it through time with much help from our many friends: staff and volunteers, who have pitched in tirelessly to help, aided by Eagle Scouts, Knights of Columbus, and landscapers with a heart - a big thank you to Tom Kalinkos.

Most recently, BHS's Facebook Fundraiser for the Lawrence Cemetery quickly raised \$1,000, and we are humbled and gratified by the generous outpouring from our wonderful Bayside community. As we put these funds to work, we are preparing to open up the Lawrence Cemetery to public tours this fall, and we hope that you will join us to learn about this historical treasure right in our own neighborhood. The 110th Anniversary of Bayside Day


Saturday, September 14th, 2024

A grand celebration, simply called **Bayside Day**, took place September 26, 1914. Bayside Historical Society will be commemorating the 110th anniversary of this community festival (and our own 60th anniversary too) with music, fun, and a few surprises.

Take a Look Back...

Cornelius Van Wyck Lawrence, the first popularly elected mayor of New York City, was born in Bayside in 1791. He served as mayor from 1834 to 1837, contending with calamitous issues during his term such as the Cholera Epidemic of 1832 and the Great Fire of 1835.

Cornelius retired back to his family home in Bayside after living in New York City and is buried at the Lawrence family burying ground at 216th Street and 42nd Avenue in Bayside, Queens.
